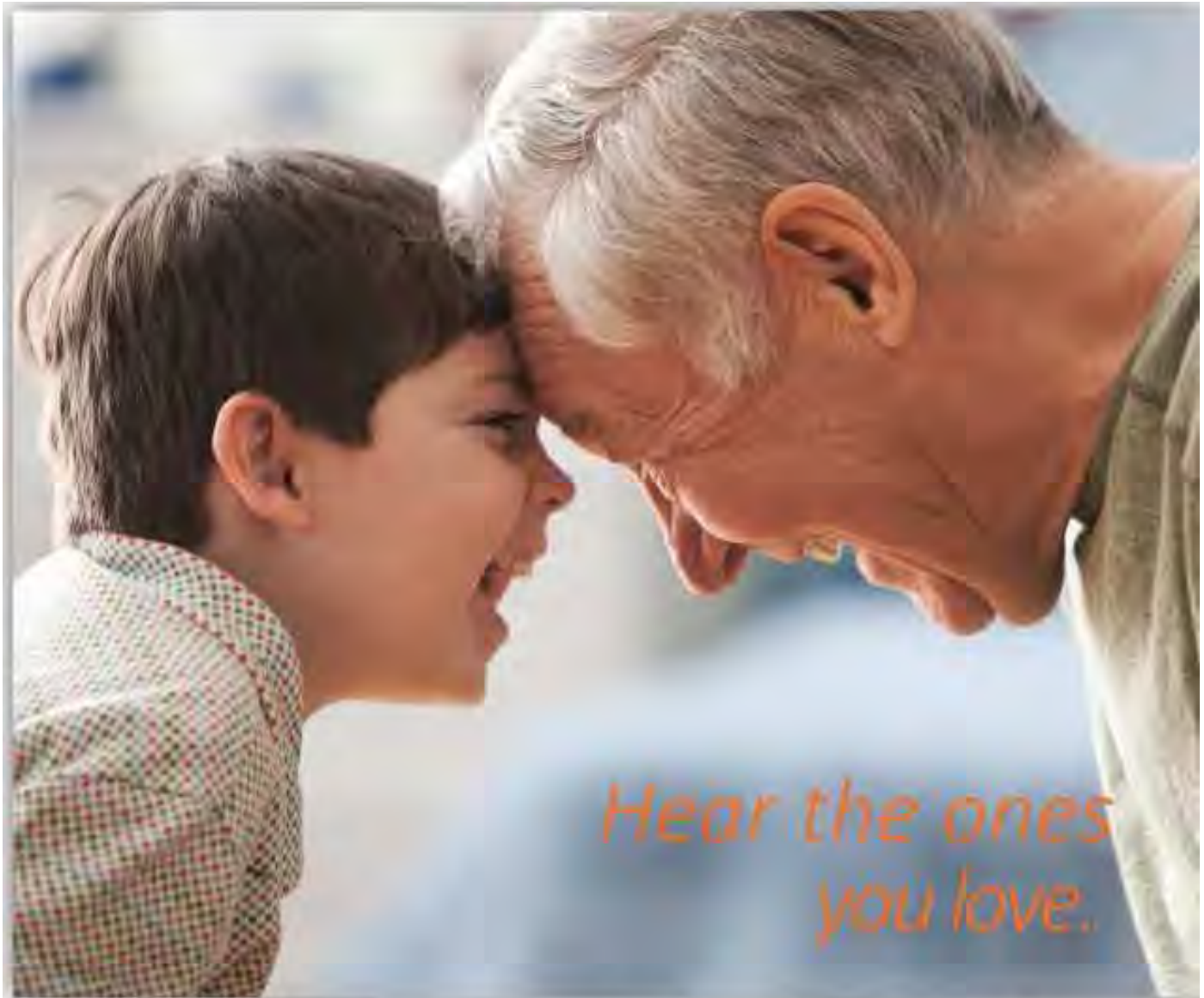

Take a bow, good people of Mandurah

A MANDURAH senior is using Facebook to great effect to help the needy.

While there are often reports of problems associated with social media, 65-year-old Kath Palmer started a Facebook page – Helping the homeless and needy in Mandurah – and in less than 12 months those who have joined the group have responded with donations of whatever is needed at the time, from food and clothing to toys, household goods and furniture.

Kath said that through working her shift at the soup kitchen in Mandurah, she and a few friends knew there were families doing it tough who were embarrassed to ask for help.

“On the other hand we knew there are a lot of people who want to help but didn’t know how,” she said.

So Kath, along with Nicole Downey, Kath Palmer, Craig Toyou, Anette Coleman and Sandy Butler, put their heads together and started the page.

“I am so humbled that so many people who really don’t know us have jumped on board to help,” Kath said.

“People in need send a private message to one of our admins and we do our best by asking for what they need.

“We screen people the best

we can see if their need is genuine – and so far we don’t feel as if we have been conned.”

Kath said to preserve the privacy and safety of those in

need, a small group of people delivered the donated items.

“We don’t ask for or give out money, but will direct people to the appropriate agencies,” she said.

“The Facebook page is all about people helping people, and the people of Mandurah have responded beyond our wildest dreams.”

Kath said there were also many people sitting at home who would like to help and the page gives them a starting point at a local level.

“Whether they want to donate items or knit or crochet items for the homeless, there is no long term commitment,” she said.

“They can just do whatever they are comfortable with at the time, and if they don’t have transport we can arrange to have donations picked up.

“We also work alongside Phil the swagman, who goes out at night, by giving him the supplies he may need to help the hundreds of homeless who are living rough in and around Mandurah.”
