PCC Ambrose is currently the Chairman of the Lions Save-Sight Foundation (WA) Inc. and the Chairman of District 201W2's Strategic Planning Committee.

I am having problems recalling just what we did in this period however I do remember with massive help from



Lion Ruth and Lion Joyce we put together a Raffle to aid the great work being done in our community by the Lions Skin Cancer detection unit. Prizes were generously donated by local business houses and \$6000 raised. When the bus arrived at Bunnings Halls Head it raised the profile of our Raffle and the effect this project has on our community at large saving lives through early detection and treatment.

December and I had the privilege of attending the book awards at Singleton primary school where at the conclusion of the awards the principal called me to the stage where 4 young people presented me with Two of the largest of Christmas hampers to be given to needy families. I was asked to return to the school several days later to collect 28 Cartons of goodies to be placed in Hampers for those in need in our community. Promoting this community spirit in our young people is highly commendable.

Then soon after we had a call from a neighbour to advise us of a family who were doing it tough. Their daughter who had cancer. Mum travelled to Perth daily and

Dad had to leave work to look after the rest of the family. President Clive raided his emergency fund to provide a \$250 fuel card to ease the burden. Discussions with our long time supporters Mandurah Murray Mayday Club saw a further \$500 fuel card and a \$500 food voucher. To top it all off Lion Lynne took one of those large hampers to the family home. Dad had tears in his eyes when he told Lynne he did not know there were people like Lions in our community.

A call from Disability services requested help for a Mum with a 12 year old child. The child had become too heavy to lift into the family car and a van with Hydraulic chair lift was required. The cost was \$20500. However the mum was proactive and had raised

RECYCLING On the first Saturday of each month, the Lion's Den becomes a hub for recycling in the city of Mandurah with regards to aluminium cans, newspapers, spectacles, car batteries, hearing aids, mobile phones and anything else of value that can be recycled.

In the future, maybe glass bottles could become a recyclable item in West Australia as exists in South Australia, where for example beer bottles are refunded 10 cents per bottle. We await the future.

Other ideas for recycling are more than welcome.

LION'S MINTS Presently we have 70 outlets in Mandurah that provide the sale of Lion's Mints. We intend to increase this number at other sites in the shire during the following year, as this produces a considerable profit for the club. A project is presently in hand where the sales of mints also provide information about becoming a Lion's member.

LION'S CHRISTMAS CAKES AND PUDDINGS The sale of the Christmas cakes (1kg and 1.5kg) and Christmas puddings (900g) was a resounding success. The former was totally purchased by mid-December whereas the latter did not sell as expected. Maybe Christmas puddings are slowly fading out.

A lot of the success can be attributed to the merging of the Christmas raffle and the sale of the Christmas Cakes/ Puddings at numerous outlets throughout the shire.

Other outlets are on the horizon.

\$13000 herself. Once again with a little help from our friends the remaining funds were forthcoming. Our sincere thanks go again to Mayday and to our friends at Bendigo Community Bank Halls Head.

Then more recently we received a call from the Mum of one of our children of courage. She had to move house and the cost of about \$2000 was too much for her. Lions William, Clive, Bob A and David helped us move house for her. I must acknowledge the really great support given by ACTON realty who lent their removal van for the day. That was a master stroke by Lion David Schumacher'.

Like I said at the start I can't recall that we did very much over the year but then I am a year older.

SANTA FOR HIRE As per normal, we advertised "Santa For Hire" in the local newspaper, but this time we drove around Mandurah and promoted Santa. A few Child Care Centres hired us, but others had previous bookings or it was too late. However this was our biggest return for this project. Next year we can expand in this area and other outlets.

CHRISTMAS EVE DELIVERIES Ten Santas and their elves drove around Mandurah delivering Christmas joy to oodles of small children between the hours of 5pm to 9pm. Over 450 presents were gifted to these youngsters who produced many a smile on their faces. Nobody got lost this time.

RECOGNITION A big thank you to all those that participated in the above projects, but there must be a special mention to Dick Ingle regarding the sales of mints and Christmas cakes/puddings, Wendy who spent many hours repairing and making new Santa suits, and those that dressed up as Santa and their elves for Christmas Eve.
